**Christmas Performances, dates for your diary** – Reception, Years 1 & 2 will be performing a nativity at 9.30am on both Monday 11<sup>th</sup> December and Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> December. The children of KS2 will be leading a Carol Service at St Joseph's Catholic Church, Eastgate Gardens, Guildford at 6.30pm on Monday 18<sup>th</sup> December. We have chosen this venue because it is easily large enough to accommodate all our KS2 children and parents. There will be plenty of parking in the York Road car park, which is right next to St Joseph's. We are

really looking forward to these special Christmas events.

**PSA Christmas Raffle** – on Wednesday we sent out, via the eldest child of each family, an envelope containing the raffle tickets. Parking – we have received a couple of complaints: firstly, from a neighbour in respect of cars parked on pavements down The Fairway and around the little mini-roundabout at the end of The Fairway. Secondly, a number of cars have been parking on the double yellow lines and the zig-zags outside the school, and also directly opposite the school exit, on the other side of the road, and on the corner with The Fairway. **Reception 2024** – if your child was born between 1<sup>st</sup> September 2019 and 31<sup>st</sup> August 2020 you will need to apply for a school place between 1<sup>st</sup> November 2023 and 15<sup>th</sup> January 2024. You must do two things before 15<sup>th</sup> January 2024:

- complete and return (to the school office) the **school SIF** which can be obtained from the school office or downloaded from the school website (School Information/Admissions then scroll down to the PDF called 'St Edmund's Godalming SIF 2024-2025').
- complete the Surrey County Council online application
