Use of Primary School PE and Sport Funding 2020-21

Background

The Government has been providing funding of £150 million.

This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school headteachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools. Funding for schools will be calculated by reference to the number of primary-aged pupils (between the ages of 5 and 11), as recorded in the annual schools census in January each year.

Purpose of funding

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this. Possible uses for the funding might include:

- hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work with primary teachers when teaching PE
- paying for professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sport
- providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE and sport
- running sport competitions, or increasing pupils' participation in the School Games
- buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE and sport
- providing places for pupils on after school sports clubs
- pooling the additional funding with that of other local schools.

In 2020/21 St Edmund's Catholic Primary School received £17,770 for School PE and Sport Funding. All pupils from Y1-6 will benefit from this funding. There was an additional carry forward of £4391. Total £22,161

Accountability

Since September 2013, schools have been held to account over how they spend their additional, ring-fenced funding. Ofsted has strengthened the coverage of PE and sport within the 'Inspectors' handbook' and supporting guidance so that both schools and inspectors know how sport and PE will be assessed in future as part of the school's overall provision.

Schools will also be required to include details of their provision of PE and sport on their website, alongside details of their broader curriculum, so that parents can compare sports provision between schools, both within and beyond the school day.

P.E. Curriculum Developing and maintaining a healthy lifestyle is a key priority in school. While lots of our children already belong to after school clubs that involve physical activity, there are some children that do not participate regularly in physical activities outside of school. At St Edmund's we aim to develop the best possible learning opportunities for all our children through improved provision in PE lessons, competitions and tournaments and access to a range of extra-curricular clubs. Meeting national curriculum requirements for swimming and water safety.

Reporting on swimming: Year 6 pupils July 2021

What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres? 93 %

What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort use a range of strokes effectively [for example, front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke]? 90%

What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations? 100%

Schools can choose to use the Primary PE and sport premium to provide additional provision for swimming but this must be for activity over and above the national curriculum requirements. Have you used it in this way? Not in 2020/21 due to COVID
