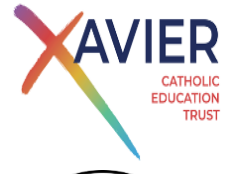

We value the support of parents in encouraging their children to do their best in all their work at school. Below are the topics, which your child will be exploring during the course of this year. 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Through the use of the 'Come and See' RE scheme your child will be covering the following areas of development.

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In all these curriculum areas it is important to discuss with your child what they have been doing and use any available opportunity to support and extend their learning.

It is also important for the progress and development of your child, that they should have any necessary equipment, kit or homework in school for the appropriate lesson. Reading records will be checked weekly to ensure your child is reading five times a week. Spellings will be uploaded weekly and ideally practised daily.
