Dear Parents,

Children's Mental Health Week – starts next week and is an opportunity to shine a spotlight on children and young people's mental health. The theme this year is 'My voice matters!' We want to empower, equip and give a voice to all children and young people in the UK.

Year 1 Class assembly – well done to the children of Year 1 who put on an excellent assembly on the theme of 'Space' today. Thank you to Mrs Eddles and support staff for preparing the children so well.

Science – Harriet, Séarlait and Yocchan told us: "This week we did experiments with maggots, to see how quickly or slowly they moved depending on the light. The maggots were dipped into a blue dye and then put onto a piece of paper. We found that they moved more slowly in the dark because, in the dark, they had no predators and were not in a rush. Then we had a chemistry show during which lots of things were set on fire. We looked at different elements and metals to see how they reacted with fire. We created a mini fire of London! One of the chemistry experiments was to show how much sugar was in a jelly baby, one was put it into a test tube of warm chemicals, and it exploded."
