Year R

This term has whizzed past yet when looking back we have managed to squeeze so much in. We started the term off my looking at 'Winter' and were able to make the most of the cold spell by playing with ice as well as looking at animals that live in snowy places. We used our writing skills to write a fact about penguins when we looked at the Emperor penguins in Antarctica. We then moved onto 'Space' and used our DT skills to create space rock-

ets. We looked at space craft from the past and then designed our own. We worked as a team to construct them using many recycled boxes, silver foil and strong tape and were very proud of our work. We again used our creative juices to paint using different techniques, the planets to scale. Again our work looks magnificent, displayed in the classroom. We have then ended the term celebrating Chinese New Year. We have made dragon puppets, taken part in dragon dancing, leant about the story of the Chinese Zodiac, run a Chinese restaurant in both the

class and the mud kitchen and then finished the week eating noodles with chop sticks. All interspersed as usual with phonics, learning lots of digraph and tricky words and maths, becoming more proficient with our numbers and 'numbers within numbers.' Haven't we done well?

Year 1



It has been an "out of this world" half term for Year 1, as they have been busy exploring and learning all about space.

This half term the children have learnt all about the first Moon Landing, thinking about how we retell events from history. A particular highlight was our class assembly where the children got to share their learning about space and the journey of getting to the moon.

The children have also been practising their recounting skills by making banana bread and then writing their own recipes to follow. The children enjoyed learning about command verbs and using these in their writing but also to programme robots in computing, making them move forward, backwards, and complete simple tasks.

In RE they have been exploring Jesus' journey from Galilee to Jerusalem learning about his childhood as he grew up and some of the miracles that he performed, a class favourite was the call of the disciples where the children made a painting a school of fish.

Year 2

Year 2 have settled into life in the new classroom effortlessly, well done everyone! We have had a busy term, finishing off addition and subtraction in maths as well as learning all about shape. We even managed to squeeze in our new topic, money which everyone thoroughly enjoyed. In English we have started our new book, The Tunnel, which has led to some fantastic portal story writing. Our RE topic this half term has been books. We discussed some of our favourite stories

and read lots of stories from the Bible. We have been learning about the history of transport and learned lots about what life was like before cars were even invented! We started



thinking about plants and seeds as part of our science and we now have an avocado seed in our classroom for us to observe.

Year 3 have had an explosive half term! Our topic – Active Planet, has kept us extremely busy across the curriculum, including our Master Readers book.

In English we have written volcano acrostic poems and studied earth-quakes, producing excellent leaflets packed full of useful information and used drama to show the best way to survive.
