Dear Parents,

Next week is Holy Week, the holiest and most important week of the liturgical year. We prepare best for the great feast of Easter by first taking time to reflect on the passion and suffering of Jesus. Thank you to the children of Year 6, who have been working hard on their Passion Play; they will perform it to parents at 6pm on Tuesday 26th March in the school hall. Everyone is invited to attend.


On Good Friday there are services, performances and outdoor witness events: **10.00** am Churches Together in Elstead are gathering on the Green in Elstead
