### Use of Pupil Premium 2012-2013

#### Background

The Pupil Premium is allocated to children from low-income families who are currently known to be eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) in both mainstream and non-mainstream settings and children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months. From 2012-13 this also include pupils eligible for FSM at any point in the last six years (known as the Ever 6 FSM measure).

Schools are free to spend the Pupil Premium as they see fit. However we will be held accountable for how we have used the additional funding to support pupils from low-income families. From September 2012, we have been required to publish online information about how we have used the Premium. This will ensure that parents and others are made fully aware of the attainment of pupils covered by the Premium and the extra support that they receive.

#### Our School

In 2012-13 St Edmund's Catholic Primary School received £4,450 for Pupil Premium for **seven** pupils. Other funding was added to this to ensure that we could support **all** of our most disadvantaged pupils.

All pupils benefitted from this funding.

#### Nature of Support

## Measuring the impact of PPG spending

Data analysis from Summer 2013 assessments show that effective class teaching and intervention programmes has produced the following results for these seven children:

- Regarding attainment, four are higher ability and two are at the national average
- Regarding progress, six children have made good or better progress in reading, writing and maths
- Two children need further intervention to continue to narrow the gap between them and the rest of the cohort

As well as the attainment and progress of these children, the programmes funded by this money have helped improve behaviour at playtimes (incidents down 35% on the previous year) and children who attend the Rainbows group continue to attain and progress at similar levels as those who have not suffered such losses.

### Looking ahead

In 2013/14, the figure is £6,300. The increase in funding will be used to pay for a tutor to work with vulnerable children on a one-to-one or small group basis to narrow the gaps in attainment – cost £2,000.
