Reading

For this week, the children should focus on the different ways of doing 'ai' (phase 3), 'ay' (phase 5) and 'a-e' (phase 5). I have attached lots of activities to practice these alternative versions of the same sound.

Writing

Linking to our topic, we will be writing **fact files** about different **minibeasts**. I have attached information about different minibeasts so that the children can pick out the important facts and put them into their own mind maps. Maybe the children could pick one or two minibeasts to focus on. This means that they can use this information to make their own fact file. They could even make an information booklet with lots of fact files if they want to!

For grammar, the children will be using the **prefix 'un-'**. We have focused on this before; learning about how this prefix makes the word do the 'opposite'. I have attached a matching activity and also a PowerPoint. If they want a challenge, the children could even write some sentences using these words.

Maths

In maths, please continue with your practical measuring activities; cookery is always the best way of practicing this.

We are also going to revise counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. There are great songs on YouTube which the children loved joining in with in class.

Great practical ideas for this could include:



You could find pairs of socks and count in 2s. You could draw around your hand to help you count in 5s. You could count the fingers and toes of everyone in the house to help count in 10s! Be as creative as possible!

I will also attach sheets so the children can practice writing the numbers. I will also attach an '100 number square' so they can highlight which numbers are counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. Maybe use three different colours to highlight the three different jumps.

Come and See

Your Come and See work this week is to make an 'Easter Wreath'. You have to order the pictures of the Easter story. You can decide how you would like to create your Wreath; for example, you could stick them in a circular shape or order them on the table or even attach them to string. You can be as creative as you want to be so long as the story is in order.

I have attached the picture you need, the writing and the PowerPoint too.

Art

You could try to make a bug house/hotel inside or outside of your house. You could just use natural materials or craft materials from home. It would be amazing to see your designs! Happy building!

Topic

Our learning this week is focusing on minibeasts. The children will begin to learn what features make an insect; for example, insects have six legs and three body parts. If other minibeasts do not have these, then they are part of a different animal group. I have attached a PowerPoint about this.

The children could sort the pictures into two different groups.

You could also try to make an insect and a different minibeast, for example, making a ladybird - an insect and then making a spider - a arachnid. You could make these out of household objects; I will attach a collage of ideas such as baking, art or just using objects around the house. If you have made your design, please send the office some pictures. It would be fantastic to see your creations!
