### Paper Plate Easter Basket



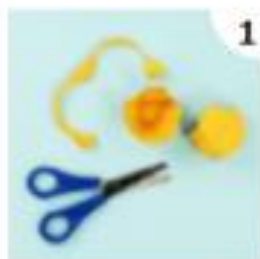
# Egg Box Bunny

## Supplies

- Coloured Card
- Glue Stick
- Two egg box segments
- Felt-tip pens
- Scissors
- Paint
- Googly eyes



- Paint brush
- Small pom-pom



- 1** Trim the egg box segments so that there are no loose edges.



- 2** Add a small strip of card to one side of the egg box, leaving an overhang.



- 3** Turn the second egg box segment upside down, then sit it on top of the first egg box segment, and attach them together using the strip of card.



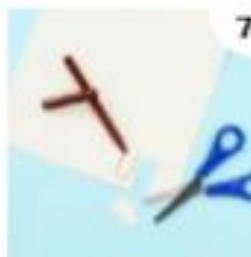
- 4** Paint the outside of both segments, then leave to dry.



- 5** Draw two ear shapes onto card, colour them in the same colour as the body of the bunny, and then cut them out.



- 6** Draw two small feet from the left over card, colour them in then cut them out.



- 7** Glue the feet onto the base of the bunny and the eyes onto the front. Finally, glue the ears onto the top of the bunny and a pom-pom tail on the back, then leave to dry.



- 8** Fill with tissue paper and small chocolate eggs or other treats.

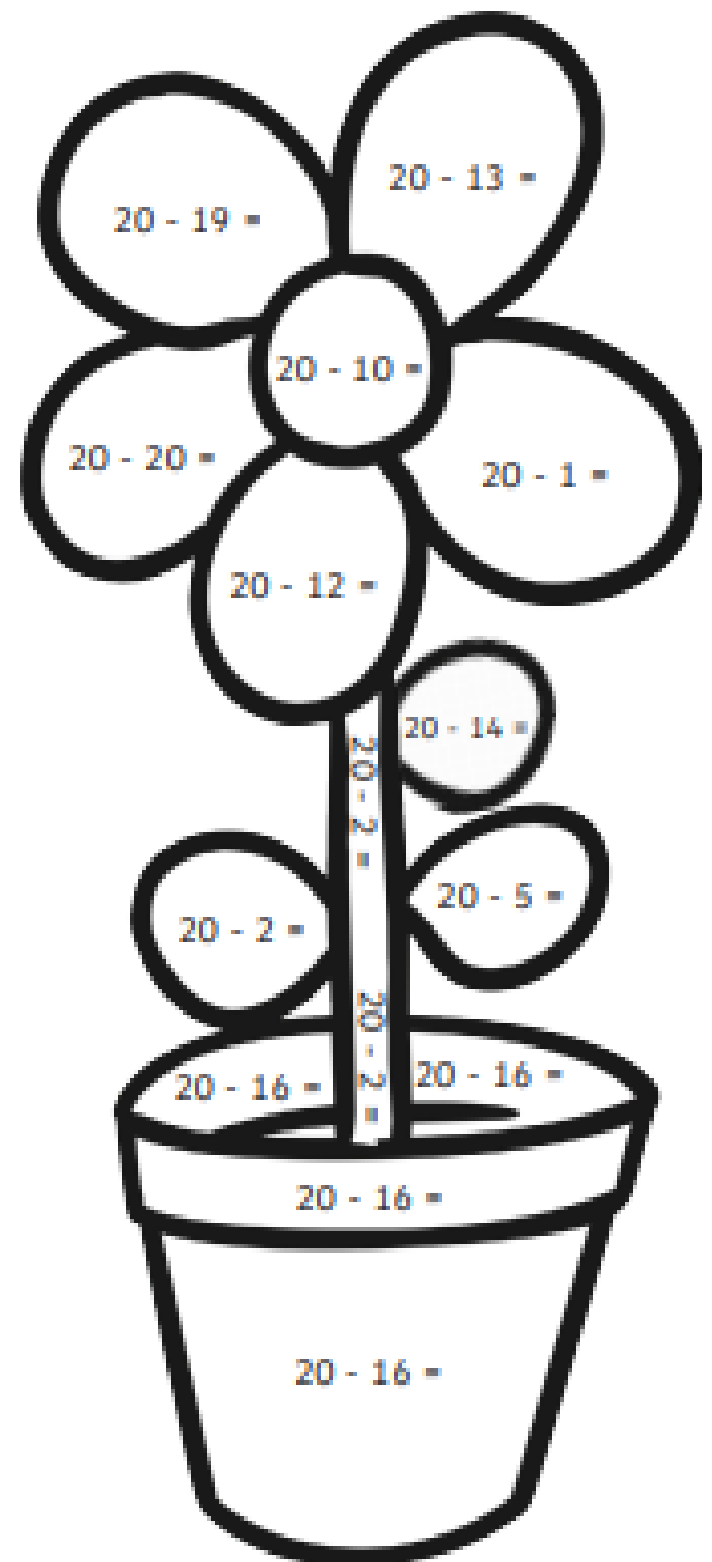
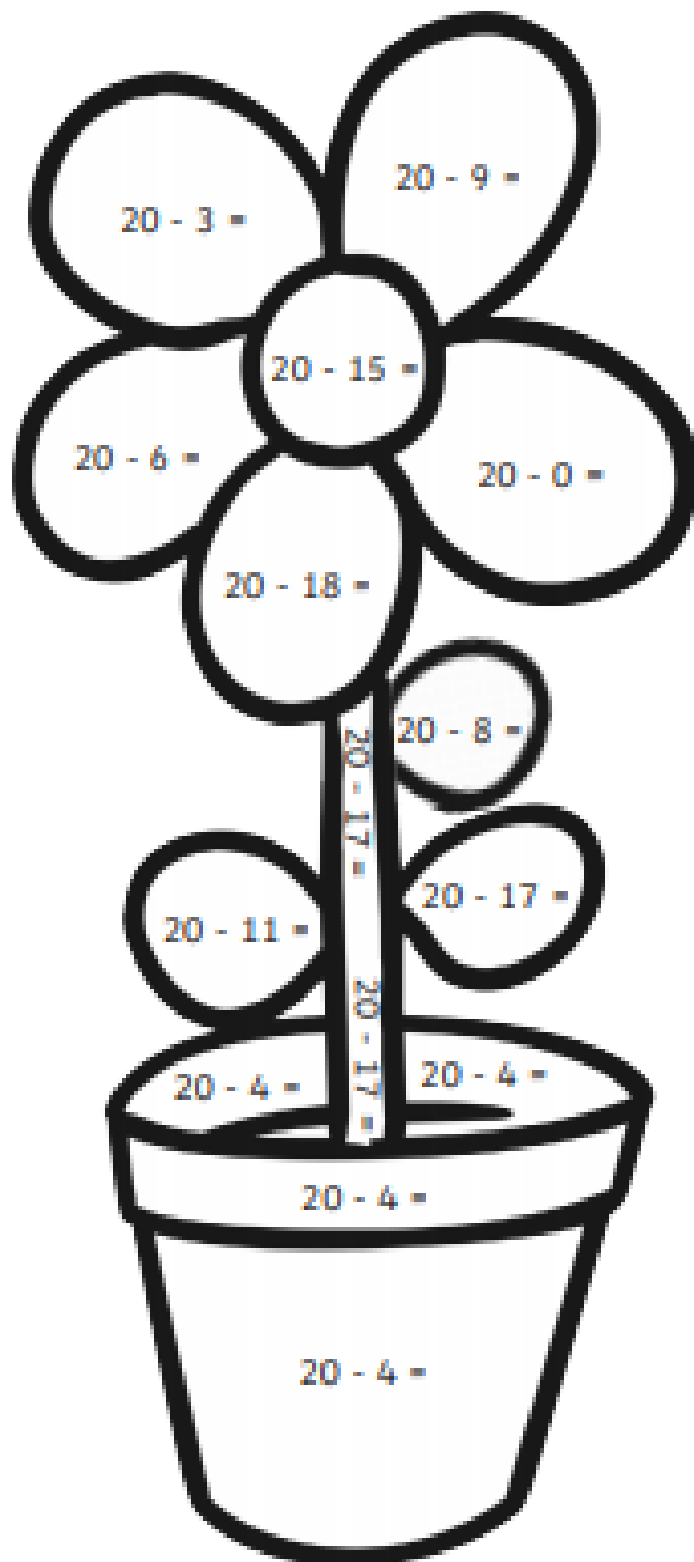
You could practice your 2D shapes by creating your own Easter Egg.

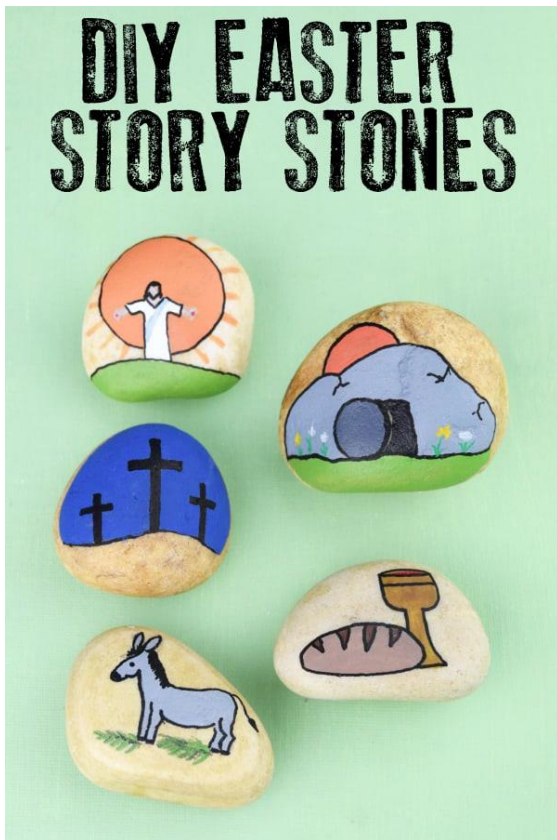
